AUTISTIC NEEDS!

We mentioned in our last newsletter our interest in tackling the Autism deficit in Sri Lanka. The needs of autistic children, especially in the north or east of Sri Lanka, are barely understood let alone tackled. Autism is hardly spoken or mentioned amongst parents, the average teachers and health workers. The primary problem is a lack of recognition and professionally trained teachers. We believe however we will be able to make long-term changes to these children's lives.

TRAINING THE TRAINERS......

We are addressing the latter by training teachers to help autistic children. We have recently completed a 30 days training program for 7 teachers (from north & east of Sri Lanka) in Chennai (in India).



The training is given by a specialised autism training school. The skills they have learnt will be invaluable back in Sri Lanka. More significantly this will be an ongoing project that will not only equip teachers to help but also parents and local educational officials who have a responsibility for autistic children.

Ultimately, we are hoping to equip and create the necessary Special Needs Centres in the north. To help support our Autistic Project we need your help! Once again if interested please e-mail us via trisha@serendipchildrenshome.come.

Our primary means of assisting the vulnerable and deprived in Sri Lanka is to fund projects on the Island that Serendip staff and volunteers deliver.

SCHOOL BAG PROJECT

Most of our projects are continuous and long-term. We however also deliver one-off help e.g. paying for special days out for mentally or physically challenged pupils.

This year we delivered some clothes and school bags to children plus some cash assistance for needy families as act of emergency relief. These families have been resettled in an ex-military occupied village called Kepapilavu (Mullaithivu). There are about 65 families who have been relocated in this village who were and are in need of desperate assistance.

Many of these one-off projects are funded by our supporters generous donations. Indeed, many young supporters have even donated birthday monies to such project!
