Vocational Courses for Young Adults

We use our own vocational centers to teach young women employable skills.

The course runs for 6 months with just over 30 people in each group.

We teach various subjects - Tailoring, Cake Making, Icing, Beauty Therapy and many more. We are confident and hopeful that the students on these courses will **find a job or even start their own business.**



Water supply to pre-schools

Some pre-schools have no water facility. We have to provide water tanks, filters and supply pipes so the schools have ongoing water supply.

We also have an ongoing project to provide tube wells. We particularly dig out and construct tube wells in poverty stricken areas for both communal use and for pre-schools.

Not only are locals/pupils able to drink clean and safe water it is also takes away the need to walk miles to collect water from central areas and thus saving a great deal of time.



Care in the Community

We help students who are struggling financially in higher education (A/L, & University) by providing them with our own individual 'bursaries'.

These are provided by individual

Supply of educational equipment including IT items

Breakfast for Pre School kids

One of our **ongoing projects** is to provide breakfast for kids in small pre-schools in underprivileged areas in the North of Sri Lanka.

Often, these children come to school without having breakfast and as we know - 'Breakfast is the most important meal of the day'.

Through this project, we have now expanded from 10 to just over 20 schools across three districts. We provide students with breakfast as well as salaries to some of the teachers. Attendance has improved since the project began and the children look healthier.

We still have a list of schools that require help.

The cost of breakfast to one child is just 15p per day.
