EMERGENCY RELIEF

Many of you will be aware of the economic crisis in Sri Lanka that erupted this year (2022). The result has led to political instability, disorder and even greater poverty. With generous donations and dipping into our reserves we tried to help, predominantly by supplying dry foods to the most vulnerable, especially to the elderly who have barely any income at all.





SPECIAL NEEDS

A lot of our activities and therapies to help children with special needs largely takes place in our two Centres. For example, we run workshops (sometimes run by outside professionals) for the parents of some of our special needs children, that will ultimately benefit their children's education and lives. Such parents will sometimes also receive assistance via our Livelihood Program i.e., sustainable self-employment.



UP-COUNTRY SUPPORT

Most charity support has traditionally focused on areas of northern and eastern Sri Lanka. However, many of the citizens in what is called the 'Up-Country' in the centre of the island, live in even more abject poverty. Many have to survive on a subsistence income, usually as teaplantation workers.

Their wages are extremely low, and their basic needs are barely met e.g., one toilet may have to serve more than 50 people and numerous villages have no access to drinking water. Every day they will walk miles to collect the water in buckets.

To help uplift their conditions, we are using our project resources to help e.g., infrastructure (tube wells/toilets), emergency relief, educational material (for poor children) and Breakfast for Kids.
