Sri Lanka's tea industry thrives on the dedication of its Malaiyaha community, descendants of those brought from India by British colonists in 1827. However, despite their vital role, these communities remain among the island's most disadvantaged, forced to live in dilapidated line-houses built during colonial times or newer but smaller mud houses. These dwellings lack basic amenities, denying residents essential dignity and hindering a healthy quality of life. During a 2021 visit, the UN Special Rapporteur on Contemporary Forms of Slavery, Tomoya Obokata, described their situation as "inhumane and degrading," highlighting the urgency for intervention.

Under our Better Homes programme, we have a dedicated Serendip Water Project where we focus on building water tanks within villages and schools to ensure the Malaiyaha community has access to clean drinking water.







PROBLEM:

Water access relies on gravity-fed systems with spring water piped down mountains. Unfortunately, years of use have caused these PVC pipes to deteriorate or break, and essential storage tanks require repairs. Unable to afford replacements, families are forced to travel long distances to collect water, a burden further exacerbated by the community's growth. New settlements face the additional challenge of lacking the funds to build new tanks and water supply systems, forcing residents to travel even further for their daily needs.

The villages are constantly at risk of drinking contaminated water from nearby rivers. Many fall ill and in a few extreme circumstances this has lead to death.

SOLUTION:

Under the Serendip Water Project, new water supply systems and water tanks are built within a village that is on our waiting list. Constructed tanks and repaired water systems provide clean, potable water within settlements. This eliminates long water-collection treks and ensures sufficient water for cooking, cleaning, and daily needs. The dignity, safety, and good health of families will significantly improve.

Each of our construction projects is done in close consultation with the villagers, tea plantation owners, and state authorities. The villagers often participate in the construction, which gives them a sense of pride and ownership over the finished water tank.



MONITORING & EVALUATION

. Baseline Data Collection:

- Conduct surveys to gather data on access to water and issues faced by the community.
- Use focus group discussions to understand the community's specific needs and challenges.

· Ongoing Monitoring:

- Carry out regular updates on the progress of the project.
- Monthly site visits to assess the quality of work and immediate impacts.

Impact Evaluation:

- Conduct end-term evaluations to assess the overall impact.
- Use pre- and post-intervention surveys to measure changes and the improvement of the lives of the beneficiaries.
